## Annual Business Meeting Minutes November 24th, 2025



The Business meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by President Connie Bailey. There were 57 members present and 1 visitor.

First on the agenda was election of 2027 officers. Slate of officers the nomination committee submitted were introduced.

President – Sue Anderson, Vice Presidents – Brenda Gigliello, Pam Cannefax and Kathy Hart, Secretary – Jennifer Cook and Treasurer – Freddiea Sullivent.

There were no additional officer nominations from the floor. A motion to approve this slate of 2027 officers was made by Patty Dikeman and seconded by Debbie Christie. All were in favor by a show of hands and motion passed.

Next on the business agenda was to vote on the community donation to a charity of the members' choice in the amount specified in the budget of \$300.00. There were four nominations. Alma Outreach Center, Antioch Group in Fort Smith, Kids Backpack Program, part of the Clearing House and Hope Campus. Votes were counted on each charity. The vote amounts were Alma Outreach with 27 votes, Kids Backpack Program with 18 votes, Hope Campus with 8 votes and Antioch Group with 4. There was a second vote for the top three. Alma Outreach had 30 votes, Kids Backpack had 21 and Hope Campus had 6. Alma Outreach was the winner of the community donation.

There was no further business, so business meeting adjourned at 6:42 pm.

## Meeting Minutes November 24th, 2025

The November 24<sup>th</sup>, 2025, regular meeting was called to order by President Connie Bailey at 6:43 pm. Fifty-seven (57) members and 1 guest were present. A motion was made by Krissy Barnes and seconded by Sue Anderson to accept the October minutes. All were in favor, and the minutes were accepted. A motion was made by Gaylon Scharbor and seconded by Faye Miller to accept the financial reports. All were in favor, and the reports were accepted.

President Bailey asked for reports from committee chairs. Dianne O'Donnell reported on the Christmas Party and presented an example of the challenge block. She stated that the party was all set with catering and the left, right, center game. She also stated there were 16 foster kids' gifts and numerous pillowcases from the members to be picked up at the Christmas Party. Last month the Board recommended our organization becoming a 501c3. Mary Butler presented all the information about the formalities of becoming a nonprofit organization. After a short discussion, a motion was made by Sue Anderson and seconded by Patty Dikeman for our organization to become a 501c3 nonprofit organization. All were in favor and the motion passed.

Under new business, President Bailey wanted to express her passion for the younger generation to begin working with fabric and the art of quilting. She reported that our bylaws state in our objectives that "It shall also be the purpose of this organization to expand and to enrich the art of quilting for future generations." She further reported that there are two things in the works to promote this. One is to teach a class or two at the Arkansas Colleges of Health Education Pipeline program at the Health and Wellness Center. Part of their mission is "driving innovation and education for sustainable health and wellness through community engaged partnerships." Our guild could become a "partner" and have classes in the spring 2026 or a summer camp. We could display wellness related quilts in their event center gallery in spring 2027. Another idea is to teach/sponsor a beginning quilting class by our guild members and to introduce ourselves to interested Family and Consumer Science classes {Home Ec}. Mary Butler hopes to begin an after-school quilting club at the Muldrow High School Consumer Science classes. To fulfil our mission, we could volunteer and donate our excess fabric, scissors, cutters, rulers etc. There is sufficient room in the storage rental facility to store items. There will be more guidance on this next year. Kim Kidder, 2026 President, asked President Bailey if she would chair an unofficial committee for the next year to plan and work on this for our guild and maybe call it a Community Education Outreach Program? President Bailey has agreed to do so. There was no further old or new business, so door prizes and 50/50 were awarded, then show and tell was presented.

Meeting adjourned at 7:30 and a strip poker game was enjoyed!

Connie will share more information at upcoming meetings. You can help grow this program by supporting our monthly tool drive.


Check your sewing space. Most of us have duplicates of the most common tools. You can de-clutter your space and create a meaningful, life long skill for the next generation of quilters.

### BPQG Quilting Tools Monthly Drive

January	Rotary cutters, mats (45 mm ideal) and replacement blades and good quality scissors; totes to keep supplies in
February	Fabric plus totes to keep supplies in
March	Thread, seam rippers and irons
April	Pins and needles, and pin cushions (holders); clips; and thimbles
May	Fabric Marking tools (chalk, blue washable pens, air-erase and SEWING MACHINES
June	Rulers to use with rotary Cutters ( various sizes, but especially 24")
July	Fabrics and any other useful quilting essentials
