There was no unfinished business for us to discuss. Under new business, Dianne ODonnell requested anyone not getting the newsletter AND you have paid your dues, to please see her.



Class: Bottom of the Drawer Quilts March 25th at the Academy

Dig out great grandma's doilies and dresser scarves to make a one of a kind quilt block. The March class on <u>Monday</u>, March 25th, at the Academy at Mama's Log House begins at 10 am. Cost for the class is \$32 and includes lunch. We will be making a quilt block using our old linens. This is a great way to preserve memories!

You Will Need

Go get grandma's hankies, dresser scarves, tatting, lace, etc. You will be cutting these pieces up to fit into your design so bring your anxiety meds if needed!

- Lightweight iron on stabilizer if your linens are very thin. Glue stick
- If you have a crocheted pot holder that looks like a flower pot, bring that or I will show you how to create a container using some of your linens.
- Any type of background fabric. I use solids coordinated with the theme of my quilt. You will make squares/rectangles to sew your laces onto, so the lace should look nice against your chosen fabric. This fabric will also be used to border your blocks.
- I use **plain white hankies** for open spaces behind my floral arrangement, but you can easily use something else
- General sewing supplies Rulers and square templates to square up your blocks

1946 "Dress Maker" Model #305 sewing machine with hard carry case. This machine powered up and sews.


